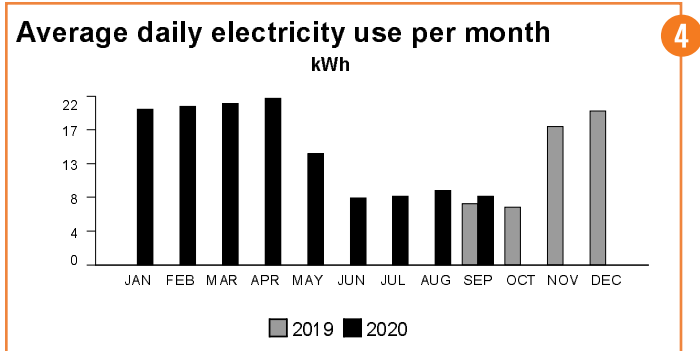

Bill Descriptions:

- 1 Account information**—Here you will find important information regarding your account, service plan, meter number and billing cycle.
- 2 Charges for electricity services**—This is a breakdown of all the charges that go into your energy cost. This will include information regarding your energy usage, adjustors and more. See the third page of this document for a full breakdown of charge descriptions.
- 3 Amount of electricity you used**—This section shows the dates your meter was read, the total amount of energy used during this billing period.
- 4 Average daily electricity used per month**—Compare this month's average daily energy use with your average daily usage last month and in the same month of the previous year.
- 5 Comparing your monthly use**—Compare the elements that can affect the cost of your bill (such as billing days, temperature, usage) with last month and the same month of the previous year.

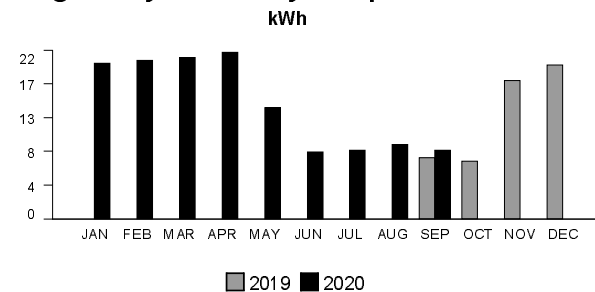

Glossary of terms:

- 1 Customer account charge**—The minimum charge for having service available, whether you used electricity or not.
- 2 Delivery service charge**—A charge, based on your kWh usage and/or kW demand, to build and operate the equipment for delivering electricity to your home, including lines, poles, transformers and substations.
- 3 Environmental benefits surcharge**—A charge to cover the costs of programs approved by the Arizona Corporation Commission, including energy efficiency and renewable energy projects.
- 4 Federal environmental improvement surcharge**—A charge to recover a portion of the cost of investments and expenses for environmental improvements at APS's generation facilities designed to comply with environmental standards mandated by federal laws or regulations.
- 5 Systems benefits charge**—A charge to cover the costs of programs approved by the Arizona Corporation Commission, including low-income assistance, demand side management, customer education, environmental, renewables, long-term public benefit research and development, nuclear fuel disposal and nuclear power plant decommissioning programs as well as other programs approved by the Commission.
- 6 Power supply adjustment**—An adjustment mechanism to recover fluctuations in fuel and purchased power costs.
- 7 Metering**—A charge for providing and servicing the meter.
- 8 Meter reading**—A fixed fee to determine your energy use.
- 9 Billing**—The cost of calculating and providing your monthly statement.
- 10 Generation of electricity**—The cost of producing the electricity you used this month.
- 11 Federal transmission and ancillary services**—The cost for moving high voltage electricity from generating facilities and other sources to the APS distribution lines.
- 12 Federal transmission cost adjustment**—A cost, based on your kWh usage, to adjust for annual charges in transmission-related costs procured to serve retail customers.
- 13 LFCR adjustor**—A charge to recover fixed costs of providing service, such as power poles, wires, and other delivery infrastructure, that are lost due to mandated energy efficiency and rooftop solar.
- 14 Tax expense adjustor**—An adjustor that provides a reduction to customer bills based on recent changes to the federal corporate income tax rate.
- 15 Regulatory assessment**—A cost imposed on customers of state-regulated utilities to help fund the Arizona Corporation Commission and Residential Utility Consumer's Office.
- 16 Franchise fee**—A charge by a municipality for APS's use of the public rights-of-way for its facilities.
